The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.	Y2 pupils have been trained as playground leaders. Children are choosing to take part in physical activity at lunchtime due to the active play activities/resources available.	Ensure that all new lunchtime staff receive training from the lead MSA. Continue to review use of equipment and suitability.
The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.	All children have found the new equipment engaging and more children are now choosing to play football during break times due to the barrier blocks and new goals. The children enjoy participating in sporting activities with Sporty Paws and completing a diary entry which is displayed on the notice board in the school hall. 100% of pupils feel proud to be involved in assemblies/photos on notice boards which is impacting on confidence and self-esteem.	This equipment will be sustainable and can be enjoyed by future pupils at break times and during PE lessons. Continuation of Sporty Paws to celebrate pupils success in assembly has no long term cost and is part of the whole school drive to ensure PE and sport are central to the lives of all pupils. NS: Class teachers will monitor achievements in PE and each class teacher will take it in turns to choose a child in their class to take sporty paws home.
