English

In English, we will continue to work on writing in full sentences remembering to include a capital letter, finger spaces, use our Fred fingers to sound out words and full stops. We will also start to use more adjectives in our writing when describing characters or settings. We will be writing many stories this half term, retelling famous stories, and creating our own. We shall also be writing instructions and fact files about famous Victorian figures.



Maths

In maths we will be continuing to solve addition and subtraction problems using Numicon, Base 10 and number lines. We will also be looking at identifying and describing 2D and 3D shapes. We will be naming shapes such as square, oblong, triangle, rectangle, sphere, and cubes. We will then describe them based on the number of sides, vertices, edges or faces they have.



Design & Technology

We will be following Victorian recipes to make biscuits and creating our own inventions.

Science

In science we will be looking at materials. We will be looking at different materials and their properties. We will also be comparing materials and assessing which materials are best for which job. We will also be completing an experiment to find out which material is the most waterproof.

History and Geography

We will be looking at the story of Guy Fawkes and why we celebrate on the 5th November. We will also be learning about life during Victorian times, what life was like in a Victorian school and how different London looked then compared to now.

RE

We will be focusing on Christianity and mainly looking at the celebration of Christmas and why Christians celebrate the holiday.

Computing

We will be using the iPads and Stop motion apps to create our own fireworks display using Lego. We will also be using voice recorders and iPads to record and retell stories.

Music

We will be learning lots of Christmas songs and using instruments to express feelings in films.

Art

We will be using lots of different art materials to create pictures and crafts to celebrate Guy Fawkes and Christmas. We shall also be looking at the artist William Morris.
